Project activities

The FAIRshare project is being led by Teagasc, the Irish Agriculture and Food Development Authority, brings together 22 partners from 15 countries across Europe.

The aim of the project is to develop an inventory of the digital tools and services in use internationally, which will be available to all advisors. Project activities are focused on developing a “living lab” which empowers advisors from across the EU to engage and interact with the online inventory. The FAIRshare will fund 40 different advisory cases that will enable advisors to address the challenge of embedding digital tools in different advisory and farming contexts across the EU. Special focus will be on co-designing powerful communication and engagement approaches for advisors to advocate and inspire their peers and farmer clients, driving a stronger network for the wider and better use of digital tools.
